
Q: Is the fish the story? NOT MAJORLY

Gentile Leader's response	⁶ The word reached the king of Nineveh , and he arose from his throne to call out mightily to God . ⁹ Who knows? God may turn and relent and turn from his fierce anger, so that we may not perish ."
¹⁵ So they picked up Jonah and hurled him into the sea, and the sea ceased from its raging .	Lord's relent	¹⁰ When God saw what they did, how they turned from their evil way, God relented of the disaster

¹ Then Jonah prayed to the LORD his God from the belly of the fish	Jonah's prayer	¹ But it displeased Jonah exceedingly, and he was angry. And he prayed to the LORD
¹⁰ And the LORD spoke to the fish, and it vomited Jonah out upon the dry land.	Lord's mercy	¹¹ "Should not I [the LORD] pity Nineveh, that great city, in which there are more than 120,000 persons who do not know their right hand from their left, and also much cattle?"
