"Submit"

(Gk: $\dot{\upsilon}\pi o \tau \dot{\alpha} \sigma \sigma \omega$, hypotassō)

"Now as the church <u>submits</u> to Christ, so also wives should submit in everything to their husbands" (Eph. 5:24).

(cf. Luke 2:51; Eph 5:21)

"Helper"

(Heb: עֵוֶר, 'ezer)

"Then the LORD God said, "It is not good that the man should be alone; I will make him a helper fit for him" (Gen. 2:18).

(cf. Psalm 121:1,2; Hosea 13:9)

TAKEAWAYS:

- The Bible affirms some male and female distinctions; to distinguish is not to denigrate.
- Gender distinctions can be misused or misread, so we must pursue their good and proper place.
- God created genders in a gospel metaphor to show Christ's relationship to His church (Eph 5:32).
